WHO WE ARE

The R7DHRE is an ASPR funded grant focused on developing a regional preparedness, all hazards health system that utilizes healthcare coalitions and teams from a diverse group of partnerships. The grant aims to identify strategies for enhancing surge capacity in large-scale disasters, both in rural and urban communities. The Region VII specifically serves- lowa, Kansas, Missouri and Nebraska.

REGIONAL EDUCATION & TRAINING



Advanced Hazmat Life Support (AHLS) – Healthcare professionals complete 16 hours of didactic training to understand how to handle clinical challenges for patients exposed to hazardous materials, biological agents, chemical emergencies and other hazardous incidents



Community Readiness Course (CRC) – Educational opportunity aimed at community members to identify how they can assist during an emergency. This course includes ACS STOP THE BLEED © hands-on training and certification.



Disaster Management & Emergency Preparedness (DMEP) – DMEP teaches planning methods, preparedness and medical management of trauma patients in mass casualty disaster situations through a one-day, 8-hour course.



Fundamental Critical Care Support: Crisis Management Course (FCCS-CM)—Focuses on core principles of disaster planning and addresses the employment of sound crisis management principles by hospitals and health systems to sustain their ability to provide care. This course is designed for healthcare professionals treating all-levels of trauma patients.



Webinars - R7DHRE hosts preparedness webinar series that educates individuals on different levels of all-hazards preparedness including tornado response, emerging infectious disease and radiological emergencies. Healthcare providers are offered CEUs for attendance at these 1-hour sessions.
